One simple pleasure

Earlier this year Helen and I went on a long-awaited trip that took us to the northern edge of England, before crossing the Pennines for a few days' rest in Anglesey.

The first stop was Seaham in County Durham, where we spent two absorbing days hunting for sea glass on the beach. Sea glass is one of Helen's passions, and looking at the crowds on Seaham Hall beach, one that is widely shared. It was almost the end of February, but hundreds of people were walking slowly along the tide line or sitting on the shingle, digging and raking for small glass nuggets to add to their collection.

It looked like a scene from the California Gold Rush, but this treasure is very different. Sea glass is made by a unique combination of human and natural processes. Humans make glass that falls into the sea, which tumbles it for decades or centuries until it becomes small smooth fragments. These have a slightly grey patina due to sea salt, but when in water or polished with a drop of oil they gain depth and colour. No two pieces are identical. It's legally classified as rubbish, so there's no problem with removing it from a beach. You may be wondering by now, why Seaham? Isn't there enough coastline in Norfolk to search?

Seaham is one of the world's hotspots for sea glass due to its unique history. By the 1890s it was home to Europe's largest bottle works, producing 20 million bottles per year. It had a series of benevolent factory owners who added a library, savings bank, town clock and promenade to the village. However, their most valuable legacy would be the waste glass that was dumped in the sea every day, returning to the shore a century later as sea glass to bless the local economy.

I have to say that sea glass hunting is curiously addictive. Finding small pieces on a vast field of shingle takes patience, concentration, and a bit of luck. It becomes very mindful, disturbed only by shouts of discovery, inquisitive dogs coming to say 'Hello' or a wave coming over the top of one's boots. Apart from getting a stiff neck, it's relaxing and can be experienced by all ages.

So far, so sea glass ... is there a spiritual message here, you may begin to wonder. There are more spiritual connections here than I can include in a brief letter. It's a bit like our lives. Sea glass starts out as shiny, smooth sheets or bottles, but is re-sized and shaped by the sea.

Our sharp edges are smoothed out by experience. Our whole lives are in a continual state of becoming, of being remade.

Sea glass may not be valuable like gold or pearls but is sufficiently scarce to make the search an enjoyable challenge. The simple pleasure it brings made us think about what gives things value and worth, just as Jesus calls us to re-evaluate what is precious in the light of his kingdom.

As we hunted around to find sea glass, we found ourselves part of a community of people on the same quest, sharing tips and sometimes our finds. We were like a kind of church on the beach. The hours we gave to searching reminded me of God's search for us, like the good shepherd in Jesus's parable of the lost sheep (Matthew 18.12-14). Our delight in finding sea glass may teach us something about God's joy in finding his children. Psalm 139 expresses this in beautiful language:

O Lord, you have searched me out and you have known me.

You know my sitting down and my rising up
you discern my thoughts from afar.

You mark out my journeys and my resting place and
are acquainted with all my ways.

How deep are your thoughts to me God and how
great is the sum of them!

If I count them they are more in number than the
sand: and at the end I would still be with you.



WHEATFEN, Surlingham - Update

The Wheatfen Nature Reserve at Surlingham is the largest independent reserve in Norfolk. Once the home of the renowned naturalist Ted Ellis, it is now managed by a Trust set up in his name following his death in 1986.

Set alongside the River Yare, Wheatfen is a magical landscape of fen, dykes, broads, flooded trees and woodland, criss-crossed by paths and boardwalks. Its 140 acres is one of the most important wetland sites in the UK and it is a Site of Special Scientific Interest.

The Trust has an ethos unlike comparable reserves. Under the watchful eye of a Warden and his Assistant, it welcomes visitors without any charge whatsoever and is open throughout the year from sunrise to sunset. As well as a dedicated band of volunteers, there are also almost 500 Friends (members) of Wheatfen.

Now the Ted Ellis Trust is looking to enhance the number of Trustees charged with protecting and improving its fragile environment. The Trust meets at least six times a year and, governed by the Charity Commission, has full responsibility for running the Reserve.

Thurton Benefice Update

Thank you: As many of you will be aware, I have been away from my parish duties since July last year with a debilitating condition with my hearing. Melanie and I have been greatly touched by the many cards, gifts and messages of support that we have received. I am very grateful to the churchwardens and others in the benefice who have managed matters in my absence as well as Nick and Helen Garrard for providing priestly support. The pattern of services was necessarily reduced, but the service cover provided by Nick and Helen along with the Rural Dean, David Owen, a number of retired clergy and the Parish Teams is very much appreciated.

I am still undergoing investigations into the cause of my condition and therapy to help with the symptoms but, following an Occupational Health Assessment, I am now permitted to undertake some of my duties with a focus on pastoral visiting and Sunday services which do not include music or singing. Sadly, I am not able to conduct funerals or weddings at present and these will continue to be covered by local clergy. I am hopeful that I will be sufficiently recovered to be able to officiate at the weddings planned in the benefice this summer.

Service Times: With my phased return to limited duties, the rota of services in the Thurton Benefice will continue to look different in the coming months. Please ensure that you check the rota on the back cover of each edition of *Eleven Says* to be certain where and when services will be taking place each week. The services listed as 'Said' will be Communion Services without hymns and will, therefore, be shorter than normal services. This may appeal to some people!!

Annual Parochial Church Meeting: This will take place on **Tuesday 30th April** at 7 pm at Alpington & Bergh Apton Church of England Primary School. It is an opportunity to hear reports on the life of the Church in this benefice, elect members of the Parochial Church Councils and encourage one another in our shared life. Light refreshments will be served afterwards.

Electoral Roll: In preparation for the Annual Meeting, a revision of the Electoral Roll for each parish will be undertaken between the 31st March and the 14th April. If your name is already on the Electoral Roll for your parish you *do not* need to complete a form as this year is a revision, not the preparation of a new Roll (this will happen next year). 

Augustine, first Archbishop of Canterbury



Augustine, a 6th century Italian prior, holds a unique place in British history. He became the 'apostle to the English', although it was with great reluctance. He was the first Archbishop of Canterbury.

In 596 Augustine was chosen by Pope Gregory to head a mission of monks whom he wanted to send to evangelise the Anglo-Saxons.

Augustine was not a bold man, and by the time he and his band of priests reached Gaul, they wished to turn back. But Pope Gregory would not hear of it. He bolstered their confidence by sending some more priests out to them, and by consecrating Augustine bishop. Finally, the party, now 40 in number, landed at Ebbsfleet, Kent in 597.

It would be fascinating to have a detailed description of that first meeting between Bishop Augustine and Ethelbert, the powerful King of Kent. Whatever Augustine said, it must have been effective, for Ethelbert granted the 40 priests permission to stay in a house in Canterbury. He even allowed them to preach to his people, while he himself considered their message of Christianity. His wife, Bertha, was a Christian princess from Paris, but she does not seem to have played any role in the conversion of Kent.

By 601 Ethelbert and many of his people had been baptised Christians. The mission to the English was well underway. More clergy, some books, a few relics and several altar vessels arrived from Rome. At Pope Gregory's wise urging, Augustine decided to consolidate the mission in one small area, rather than try and reach all of Kent. So Augustine stayed in Canterbury, where he built the cathedral and founded a school. He left temporarily to establish a *see in London.

Also, at Gregory's wise urging, Augustine did not destroy the pagan temples of the people of Kent, but only the idols in them. In this way, innocent rites were taken over and used for the celebration of the Christian feasts. Meanwhile, before his death in 604, Augustine helped Ethelbert to draft the earliest Anglo-Saxon written laws to survive and so influenced British law for centuries to come.

* A see is the place in which a cathedral church stands, identified as the seat of authority of a bishop or archbishop.



Quick tips to help your garden wildlife

From the freezing depths of winter to scorching hot summer days, helping our local wildlife is certainly an important job all year round. Conditions that are hard on us are also difficult for our garden wildlife to deal with, so it's vital that we do what we can to make things easier for the birds, mammals, insects and other creatures that we share our neighbourhoods with.

Here are some of our quick tips to lend a hand all year round.



Spring

Plant nectar-rich flowers

Although many gardens look impressive, they can actually be deserts when it comes to biodiversity. To attract pollinating insects like butterflies, bees and hoverflies, plant flowers such as lavender, foxglove and cornflower that are rich in nectar. To support birds, you can choose plants that produce berries, like hawthorns, rowan and holly, or offer seed-producing plants such as sunflowers and teasels.

Get composting

As the weather warms up and we start gardening again it's a great time to begin your own compost pile. It is relatively cheap to buy a specialist bin (or make your own) into which you can feed food leftovers, garden waste and paper to provide a valuable habitat for invertebrates and amphibians. Eventually it will turn into an enriching compost that can be used to add nutrients and help promote growth in your garden.






Bergh Apton Arts

Former churchwarden of St. Peter's, Chris Hawes, who died on November 24th 2022, regularly expressed a wish to his three daughters that the clock faces on the church be restored to their former glory. With the help of St. Peter's PCC, his daughters Pippa, Jessica and Jo have organised and funded for this restoration to take place this summer, in accordance with Chris' wish. The work will be carried out by Smith of Derby who made and installed the clock in 1928, at the same time as the Ellacombe and five static bells were installed by John Taylor of Loughborough.

The team from Smiths intend to visit in May to remove the three clock faces by abseiling from the tower. The faces, along with the associated drive mechanism, will be taken to Derby for complete restoration including repainting and re-gilding. All being well they should be refitted in time for St. Peter's annual Gift Day which this year includes the launch of the Roof Appeal. This will be an open day on Saturday 29th June to coincide with St. Peter's Day and hopefully we will be blessed with some sunshine to display the restored clock faces in all their splendour.

So don't forget to keep an eye skyward in May to see figures dangling from the church tower!






