Capturing God's Farming Wonders, Making Our Hearts Sing . . .

Living in Norfolk, everyone told me that it was, of course, God's own country. Who could argue? It's hard to deny that with the beautiful countryside, unspoilt beaches and wide, wide skies, Norfolk is a very special place. And I am sure I would never have doubted God's choice of residence had we not moved to Yorkshire where folk say exactly the same thing about their home county too. Yorkshire also has spectacular countryside, beautiful beaches and pretty impressive skies although the weather is admittedly much more changeable!

Just over two years ago we moved from the Thurton Benefice at the end of my curacy, to Westow near Malton in North Yorkshire when I was appointed to the post of Interim Rector in the Parish of West Buckrose. West Buckrose comes from an old Danelaw name for the area which covers about 100 square miles on the edge of the Yorkshire Wolds.

West Buckrose is a united parish of 9 villages and 8 churches. The churches range from the tiny church of St John the Baptist in Acklam, which was built in 1794 as a Wesleyan Methodist Chapel, to the much grander Church of All Saints in Settrington, started in the 12th Century but much added to over the years, until it has become our largest church of all.

We have churches on hills where you can see for miles, churches in the middle of the fields with dairy cattle as neighbours, and churches in the hearts of the villages. No two are the same or even similar.

It is very much the same as Norfolk but also very different, and I think it is safe to say I have had a fairly steep learning curve in making the transition!



Firstly, although it is hard to go anywhere fast in Norfolk, Yorkshire is similar but with more horses - because this is horse racing country - more cyclists - think 'Tour de Yorkshire' - and far more tractors. The tractor run is a way of raising money for charity which is wonderful until you are caught behind twenty or more David Brown or Fergie tractors, bouncing their way along the main road without a care in the world.

Secondly, there is the weather. When people say there has been no real snow for 15 years, they don't mean there has been no snow at all, only that it hasn't quite reached acrtic proportions for a while. My Fiat 500 may have coped with the Beast from the East, but it was no match for the snow here in

January when it failed to get up any of the local hills leaving me at a loss to find a way home and having to cancel all the services.

But perhaps my greatest learning has been about agriculture. As we left Norfolk, the Limbach family gave me a copy of a book by Gervaise Phinn, a writer who had been a school inspector in North Yorkshire. They had earmarked a particular chapter for me to look at without further comment and I am so glad I read it. In the story, the hapless inspector decided that sharing a picture book about a sheep with country children would be a way to gain their trust. Instead, he created a near riot as the children argued over exactly which breed of sheep the illustrations were supposed to be. This should be required reading for all rural vicars!



So much here revolves around the farming year with major events such as weddings and baptisms being timed to avoid drilling or lambing or harvest. I have learned, thanks to Mr Phinn, that as a non-farmer, talking about farming, shepherds, harvest or sheep is a dangerous game. This is quite awkward given that Jesus is the Good Shepherd and many stories in the Bible rely on imagery from farming, but I now have a shortcut to Farmer's Weekly on my laptop which helps immeasurably!



But church is so much more than buildings and we have been lucky to find church communities as lovely here as those in Norfolk, with kind and supportive people eager to grow the church and share the Gospel. We have brought with us some of the traditions of Thurton - our Palm Sunday procession (with donkeys this year), the Good Friday Walk and the blessing of the vineyards on St Martin's Day and have added in a few from Yorkshire too - I have now blessed my first plough!

But which one is really God's own country? It is hard to say. Both are wonderful examples of his handiwork, that make our hearts sing. His presence is easy to see in both places and he is clearly at work both in the North and the East. So I am not sure it is for me to decide which it is, but one thing I am sure of and that is, if he lives in one, he definitely has his second home in the other.

Let's hope this year it will be just as successful!


Since the Bike Ride event started in 1983 The Norfolk Churches Trust has raised an incredible £4.4 million. A tremendous effort by everyone who has taken part.



David Moar, MBE

Sadly, David Moar MBE who lived in Claxton, passed away in May. He was the President and Co-Founder of the Big C Cancer Charity that improves the lives of those suffering with cancer and supports their families in so many ways.

The Charity was founded in 1980 and has raised £45 million in 45 years with the help of the people of Norfolk, for the people of Norfolk and North Suffolk.

David once said, "Sometimes I think we all have a purpose in this world and I wonder whether mine was to create Big C as it is today". David's legacy is not only in the buildings that bear the Big C's name but the comfort and care so many have received over the years.

David grew up in Langley, he had a farming heritage, but became a car mechanic and has enjoyed cars and speed all his life. Sadly, cancer took this career away, but after he recovered, he found his knowledge of farming enabled him to find a position in Loddon Farmers, which has evolved into Anglia Farmers and he was the Business Development Manager for many years until his retirement.


Big Butterfly Count 2025

By the time you read this article this year's Big Butterfly Count will have been underway since 18th July. However it does not close until Sunday 10th August so there will still be a week in which you can count and record butterflies and day-flying moths. The Big Butterfly Count is organised by the Butterfly Conservation Society:

https://bigbutterflycount.butterfly-conservation.org

Anyone can take part by visiting their website and downloading a butterfly chart and a free App. Last year's Big Butterfly Count revealed such a serious decline in butterfly numbers that the Society declared a "Butterfly Emergency". Some beautiful and once common species showed serious declines; Red Admiral numbers were 82% down, Small Tortoiseshell numbers down 72%. The society wrote

to the Secretary of State for the Environment asking for an immediate ban on neonicotinoid pesticides, to prevent the real possibility of the extinction of some butterfly species. It is important, if we want to preserve our butterflies and ensure that our children and grandchildren will be able to see these most iconic of





The at times humorous character was the old bag lady. This role was played very well indeed by Louise Vennas her character developed and her sad story was revealed.





Children delighted in the traditional games, hook-a -duck, the coconut shy, and face painting were all big hits, plus there was the popular dog show.


